



The Huckeby Conservation Area provides habitat for species of Southern Rocky Mountain wildlife. In this parcel you may see elk, mule deer, red fox, coyote, ducks, Canada geese, great blue herons, hawks and various species of songbirds. Brown trout, rainbow trout and numerous aquatic insects can be found in the East River or the nearby pond bordering Cement Creek Road. Pollinators, wildflowers and plants are present here as well as trees such as alders and willows that line the East River. There is also an area of spruce and fir forest at the northern end of the property.

#### TYPES OF WETLANDS IN THE HUCKEBY CONSERVATION AREA:

- 1) The East River and the streamside wetlands absorb sediments, which are a natural pollutant in rivers, reduce potential flooding, maintain the ecology of the river and provide important habitat for wildlife and plants.
- 2) The pond provides quality habitat for trout and waterfowl.

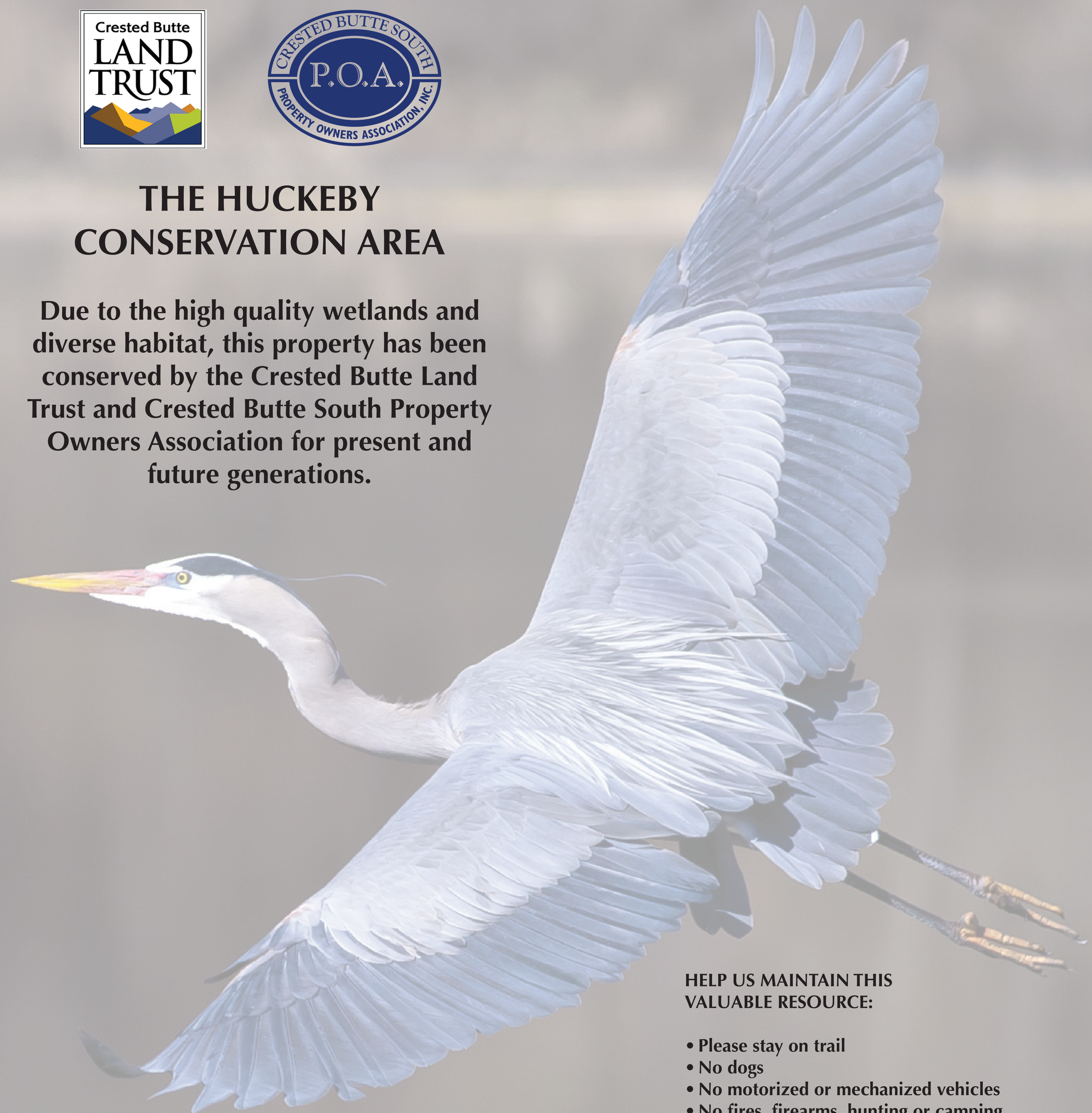
